What is it?

The School-Age Professional Credential (SAPC) is a competency-based program modeled after the Child Development Associate (CDA). The SAPC meets Keystone STARS Staff Qualifications on the Career Lattice! You may be eligible for an annual award if you work at a Keystone STARS program! Gain skills and knowledge to use in your school age program!

What are the benefits of a SAPC?

- Recognized throughout Pennsylvania and the Keystone STARS Continuous Quality Improvement System.
- The SAPC coursework counts as college credit.
- Earn annual Education Retention Awards from Keystone STARS.
- Original SAPC is valid for 3 years and the renewals are valid for 5 years.
